BEFORE YOUR ARRIVAL



BEFORE YOU LEAVE HOME



Before you leave your home, you can do some essential things to ensure your arrival in Indonesia is smooth as possible.

It would be best if you did some pre-arrival checklists before leaving your home country.



APPLY FOR INDONESIAN STUDY PERMIT

After you are accepted into the Indonesian educational institution, you have to apply for a Study Permit from the Ministry of Education in Indonesia. Since, at this point, you may still be abroad, we will help you with the application process and issue your certificate of acceptance.

After The Ministry of Education issues the study Permit, they will forward it to the Immigration Department Office in Jakarta to issue your visa. The Immigration Department will forward the letter to the Indonesian Embassy/Consulate where you intend to apply for an Indonesia Student Visa (VITAS).

IMPORTANT

Due to the new rule from the immigration office, we need more than two months to process this permit to our ministry. Please make sure you already give us your complete application a maximum of **three months before your departure to Bandung**.

The documents you need to apply for a Study Permit include:

- A copy of your passportA copy of the recommendation letter issued by your university
- A copy of your Letter of Acceptance
- The completed application form
- A letter of recommendation from the Indonesian Embassy/Consulate in your country of residence
- A copy of your academic transcript and record
- Your Curriculum Vitae (CV)
- A passport-sized photograph
- A letter of a financial guarantee or a sponsorship certificate that proves you can cover your study and living expenses
- Health certificate

APPLY FOR AN INDONESIAN STUDENT VISA (VITAS)

When the immigration department sends the visa authorization to the embassy or consulate, you can apply for your VITAS. There may not be an embassy or consulate of Indonesia in your country, in which case, you have to find which one is responsible for your jurisdiction.

Important steps to apply for VITAS:

- 1. Contact the embassy/consulate or visit their website to learn about the visa application requirements. You can look it up on the internet if you don't know the address or contact of the Indonesian Embassy in your country. You can visit the Indonesian foreign ministry portal the on kemlu.go.id/portal/id/kontak-kami# kontakemail: or kami@kemlu.go.id
- 2. Collect the required documents for the application.
- 3. Pay the Indonesia visa fee.
- 4. Submit the documents at the Indonesian Embassy or consulate by email or in person.
- 5. You should check your application once they have a decision.

IMPORTANT

The exact process varies from country to country. So the first thing you should do is **contact the Indonesian Embassy or Indonesian Consulate responsible for your jurisdiction**.

GET STUDENT HEALTH INSURANCE



Your visa may require you to prove that you are covered for unexpected medical bills you might incur while studying abroad. Your primary insurance or university-sponsored insurance might not offer coverage abroad. We highly recommend obtaining local Indonesian health insurance upon arrival.

CHECK YOUR FINANCIAL AID FOR YOUR TERM ABROAD



If you plan to receive financial aid (grants, sponsorship, or personal loans), it is your responsibility to make the necessary arrangements before your departure. Check again about your financial aid before you leave your home. Please ensure you arrive in Indonesia with sufficient IDR currency to get you through your first few days.

BOOK YOUR FLIGHT



Start booking your flight. International flights tend to be the most affordable about 3-4 months in advance, Though it's a good idea to start tracking prices early. The longer you wait to buy, the more expensive you can expect your flight to be.

Here's a list of international airports for your arrival:

Nearest Airport:

Bandung - Husein Sastranegara International Airport (8.5 km)

Jakarta - Soekarno-Hatta International Airport (173.4 km)

PACK YOUR ITEMS

Please make a study abroad packing list to help you organize your bags. Pack the following in your carry-on in any case your checked baggage is lost or takes extra time to arrive.

a. Clothes

- 1. Standard shirts, pants, dresses, skirts, and other go-to clothes. Indonesia is a tropical, hot climate year-round, which means you should choose light, breathable clothing and moisture-wicking abilities. Materials like cotton, linen, and rayon are great choices.
- You could organize at least one nice outfit and one pair of nice shoes for a special occasion.
- 3. Jacket for chillier weather.
- 4. Workout clothes and shoes.
- 5. Bathing suit (if you need it).
- 6. More underwear and shocks.

b. Toiletries & Medicines

- 1. Travel-size shampoo, conditioner, body wash (buy more after arriving)
- 2. Cosmetics and lotions
- 3. Feminine products
- 4. Sunscreen
- 5. Medications or prescriptions

MAKE COPIES OF YOUR TRAVEL DOCUMENTS

You can make a minimum of three copies of your passport, VISA, medical insurance, ID card, and any other important documents. Keep one set of copies in your checked luggage, another group in your carry-on, and the third set of copies with your family. This precaution is vital in some cases your document is lost or stolen.

LEARN ABOUT YOUR NEW HOME





Learning about your destination is also important, especially about language and culture. Getting a basic grasp of the Indonesian language will help when you arrive in Indonesia. You also can pick up a phrasebook with the most useful phrases you will need to know to get around and communicate with locals.

Don't forget to learn about the culture like the rules and traditions, food, etc. Being aware of the culture before you go will ease culture shock and help you appreciate your new country.

The latter part of this guidebook will help you learn some of the important cultures and daily language.

DOWNLOAD USEFUL APPS



FIGURE OUT HOW YOU WILL COMMUNICATE ABROAD



The smartest choice for communication while studying abroad is to either purchase a temporary phone when you arrive in Indonesia or buy a local SIM card if your phone is unlocked.

Temporarily, you can use public wifi provided in public areas. In the airport, you can use their free wifi access. You can use Bandung Juara wifi in certain public places such as city parks, sports facilities, places of worship, and other public places in Bandung. Bandung Juara is a free wireless internet service provided by the Bandung city government.

Purchase a local SIM card:

There are five mobile internet providers in Indonesia: **Telkomsel**, **XL**, **Indosat IM3**, **3** (**Tri**), **or Smartfren**. The first four operators are the main ones with an extensive network in Indonesia. However, we recommend you to buy a **Tekomsel** Prepaid SIM card because this provider has the best coverage, especially if you are traveling to the outer islands.

It is easy to buy a local SIM card In Indonesia. You can find it on a retail kiosk, convenience store, gas station, mobile phone shop, official retail store, or the airport. The airport kiosk usually offers tourists traveler packages and helps you with the registration process. Buying at airports is convenient if you don't mind paying a higher price.

Going to kiosks is also a popular way to buy a SIM card. You can easily spot a booth by noticing a signboard. They offer SIM cards from a variety of internet providers. Registration can be done at the kiosks. However, you need to ask your Indonesian buddy to accompany you since all sellers are usually locals who do not understand English. Don't forget to bring your passport whenever you want to buy a SIM card.

5 easy steps to connect with Bandung Juara wifi:

- 1. Turn on wifi on your phone and connect to **Bandung Juara wifi.**
- Download Bandung Juara app from Google Play Store for Android or App store for IoS.
- 3. Run Bandung Juara app.
- 4. Manually register to the application or login using social media accounts such as Instagram, Twitter, Facebook, Google account, or LinkedIn.
- 5. Click the wifi icon on your phone to connect with **Bandung Juara**.

LET YOUR FAMILY KNOW YOU'VE ARRIVED

Don't keep your family worrying about you. Call or send a message to let them know you've arrived.

FIGURE OUT HOW YOU WILL PROCEED FROM THE AIRPORT

Husein Sastranegara International Airport (Bandung)



We will pick you up if your arrival airport is Husein Sastranegara International Airport, Bandung.

IMPORTANT

Please send your flight schedule and information to our representative at least three days before your departure, especially if you need a pick-up service.

Soekarno-Hatta International Airport (Jakarta)



We can't pick you up from Soekarno-Hatta International Airport, Jakarta. Therefore you have to take a shuttle from the airport to Bandung.

You can use one of the many shuttle services such as Citi Trans, XTrans, or Lintas located on Shelter Bus in Terminal 1, Terminal 2F, and Terminal 3. We will pick you up from the shuttle pool in Bandung. Please send your shuttle schedule to our representative before you depart from Jakarta.



CHANGE YOUR INDONESIA STUDENT VISA (VITAS) TO TEMPORARY RESIDENCE PERMIT (KITAS)



After you arrive in Indonesia with your VITAS, you have to go to the Immigration Department within 30 days to receive your temporary residence permit (KITAS).

Documents required when you apply for a student KITAS:

- 1. Passport
- 2. The letter of acceptance
- 3. The letter of recommendation or the certificate of sponsorship from your university
- 4.A copy of the visa
- 5. A copy of the study permit
- 6. Your CV
- 7. Your academic reports
- 8. Proof of financial responsibility from your parents, legal guardians, or a sponsor during your studies

REGISTER YOUR RESIDENCY

After receiving your KITAS, you have to get the Registration for Temporary Resident (SKPPS). First, go to the local police department and get a Police Report Letter (STM), register your STM in the local municipality's population office, and receive your certificate of SKPPS.

To register your residency, you need the following documents:



- 1.Letter of request for STM from Politeknik Negeri Bandung
- The letter of recommendation or the certificate of sponsorship from Politeknik Negeri Bandung
- 3.A copy of your passport and your KITAS
- 4. Passport-size pictures

OFFICE INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

International students and candidates in Politeknik Negeri Bandung will receive assistance from the Office of International Affairs (OIA). Whether you have problems applying for a student VISA or you would like to contact other students, an OIA staff will assist you.

The OIA also manages The International Study Buddy Programme, a community of local students who helps international students to adapt to student life in Bandung even before arrival. A buddy student can help to answer any questions you may have concerning campus life, formalities, or studies. You can ask the OIA staff to connect you with a student buddy.

Welcome Reception

The OIA organizes Welcome Reception for all new international students. During the Welcome Reception, we provide important information on studying at Politeknik Negeri Bandung, and you can consult your problem in transition if any. You will also have the chance to meet your student buddy in person, participate in a campus tour, Bandung city tour, and much more.

Most lecturers explain the material often using slides or examples, interactive sessions with discussion, and presentations by students in several objects. As a student, a lot of your work will be based on individual assignments or in groups. To optimize the use of information technology to support learning activities, Politeknik Negeri Bandung has provided an e-learning system implemented with an integrated online learning paradigm using an LMS (Learning Management System), namely **Moodle**.

DIVERSITY ON CAMPUS





ACADEMIC RESOURCES

1. Laboratories



There are dozens of labs in Politeknik Negeri Bandung that can be used for courses that need practical work. Every department and program has many labs.

2. Library



You can find the main library on the first floor of the H Building. There are many kinds of books here, from books related to courses to fiction novels are here.

3. Language Centre (UPT Bahasa)



UPT Bahasa provides English courses and certifications (English Proficiency Test and TOEIC). The location is on the third floor of the P2T Building.

4. Computing & Technical Services



Here you can get and fix all related to computing and technical services, such as get your student email, e-learning account, free software license, etc. The location is on the third floor of the P2T building. There are also computer labs for students enrolled in computer-related courses.

SCHOLARSHIPS & FINANCE

Scholarship

You can try to apply for several scholarships to reduce the costs related to study in Politeknik Negeri Bandung. For example, is Darmasiswa scholarship, Darmasiswa is a scholarship program offered to all international students from countries that have diplomatic relationships with Indonesia to study the Indonesian language (Bahasa Indonesia), art, and culture. Single Tuition Fee (UKT)

Politeknik Negeri Bandung applies a single tuition fee or UKT per semester for its students so that you won't get any added cost to study in Politeknik Negeri Bandung. But you still have to pay for your own assignment or project that you do. UKT is determined at the time of admission, but if you have trouble paying for paying UKT, you can apply to lower or delay the payment after that.



CAMPUS & SERVICES

1. Canteen and Minimarket



There is one main canteen called *Pujasera* located behind Aeronautical Hangar (*Hanggar Aeronautika*). You can find many stands that sell foods and drinks here. There are also tables you can use to eat and drink.

In general, the canteens only accept cash payments. Therefore it is highly recommended that you always have cash on hand. The minimarkets at Politeknik Negeri Bandung, such as Labbis Mart at B Building and KWP at A Building, usually accept payments via cash, e-money, or debit cards.

2. Praying Room



If you are Muslim, you can find a praying room almost in all the buildings. Polban also has a mosque located on the front side of Politeknik Negeri Bandung, named Luqmanul Hakim Mosque.

3. Sport Fields




The location is near the back gate. Here, you can do sports like football, volleyball, badminton, or probably just stretch body.

Dormitory

There are 3 dormitories in Politeknik Negeri Bandung, that is A, B, and C Dorm

A-Dorm

A-Dorm is a dorm for female students who get Bidikmisi scholarships or female students applying for the dorm when first accepted into Politeknik Negeri Bandung. The dormitory is only available for the first year of college.

B-Dorm

B-Dorm is similar to A-Dorm but for male students.

C-Dorm

C-Dorm is especially for students who get ADik scholarships from Papua province, and they can use the dorm as long as they're Politeknik Negeri Bandung students.

LIVING IN BANDUNG

Bandung, the capital of West Java province, is the third-largest city in Indonesia and is surrounded by mountains. Located approximately 140 kilometers from the capital of Indonesia, Jakarta, Bandung has cooler year-round temperatures than most other Indonesian cities. Situated at 768m and surrounded by the lush and beautiful Parahyangan mountains, the climate is mild and pleasant.

The city has been well known for its universities, creative industries, and a great place for gastronomic adventure. The Dutch nicknamed *Parijs van Java* (Paris of Java) for its resemblance to Paris and the European atmosphere back in colonial times.



Talking about the natural beauty and weather of the city, Bandung is always on the list. History writes that the *Flower City* (a well-known name for Bandung, in Bahasa, called *Kota Kembang*) witnesses several national historical stories. This city has recorded Indonesia's great history, such as Jalan Asia Afrika, where the Asian-African Conference was held in Bandung in 1955.

People in Bandung are usually polite & friendly.

You will meet traffic jam at certain times, like in the morning when workers go to work.






The price of culinary in Bandung is affordable. The culinary taste is good.

You can find food stalls or *warung* everywhere. Cafes are also everywhere.

PHONE & INTERNET



If you carry your phone from your country, you may need to register your IMEI number at the Indonesian Customs Office to use an Indonesian SIM card in your phone. But you can also buy a new phone locally to use an Indonesian SIM card, or if that's too much, you can buy Indonesian modem wifi so you can still use the internet.

SIM PHONE CARD

People usually buy SIM phone cards at the nearest mobile operator outlets. You can register your SIM card with your passport or KITAS.

PHONE & MODEM WIFI

You can buy phone & modem wifi online through an Indonesian marketplace like **Tokopedia** or **Shopee**. But if you like to buy it offline, it is recommended to buy it in **BEC** (Bandung Electronic Center). You can find any electronics that you need in BEC.



If you're in Bandung, as long as you're not too far from the city center, you can expect you'll get an internet signal. Phone signals usually cover a larger area. The price of mobile data is pretty affordable. Depending on the provider being used, you can get 75 GB of data for IDR 150.000.

BANKING



There are many banks in Indonesia, but we recommend you make an account at a state-owned bank like BRI (Bank Rakyat Indonesia) because they have the most ATM networks. However, Politeknik Negeri Bandung's student card has been bundled with the BRI account.

If you want to use a private bank, we recommend using major banks like **BCA** (Bank Central Asia) or digital banks like **Jenius** from Bank BTPN and **Jago** from Bank Jago because it's convenient.

If you want to get IDR with your ATM from your own country, you can use an ATM with the same logos on your ATM cards, like Visa or Mastercard. Keep in mind that the withdrawal limit per transaction in an ATM is IDR 2 million to 3 million depending on the machines (IDR 100.000 or IDR 50.000 banknote machines). And also, the fee that charges to your account depends on your bank and the ATM you use.



ACCOMODATION



BOARDING HOUSE

The boarding house is the best deal if you only need a bedroom because it's the cheapest one compared to others. You can try to find a boarding house with an app called **Mamikos**. The rent cost for a boarding house is around several hundred thousand rupiahs, up to millions of rupiahs per month. Depending on the provided facility, you may find a better deal if you pay the rent yearly.

RENTED HOUSE

A rented house is better if you want facilities like a kitchen. It can be the best deal if you manage to find people willing to share the rented house with you. Some rented houses may not have furniture ready to use, so you must check it before signing the contract. You can also look for a rented house at the **Mamikos** app, usually rented annually.

APARTMENT

If you want better security and privacy and do not mind the cost, an apartment is the best option. You can get a complete facility such as a swimming pool and gym. You can find apartments at the **Travelio** app, and you can rent them daily, monthly, or yearly.

TRANSPORTATION

Usually, people in Bandung use motorcycles to travel. But if you don't have a motorcycle, you can use many kinds of public transportation, like an online taxi or regular taxi. You can also use public transportation such as *angkot* (angkutan kota) or bus if the angkot or bus route is available. However, angkot or bus takes more time. Therefore you have to make sure you are not in a rush. Another public transportation is an online motorcycle taxi. This alternative is more expensive than angkot or the bus but a lot faster. You can use the **Gojek** app or **Grab** app on your smartphone.

ANGKOT Price rates for Angkot are IDR 2.000 - Rp7.000 depending on the distance traveled. You can find the angkot route at dishub.jabarprov.go.id/angkutan/kabkota/301.html or use try to use Google Maps from your phone to find out which angkot route is available TRANS METRO BANDLING (TMB) TMB is a bus rapid transit that's operated in Bandung. The price is fixed wherever you depart and arrive at an average of IDR 5.000. SHOPPING

You can find many small grocers or supermarkets in Bandung. However, the most recommended one is **Toserba Borma** because this supermarket is usually cheaper than others with many products offered. If you are comfortable, you can also try to go to a traditional market because here you can haggle the product's price to get the best price. You can also find pop-up markets or **pasar kaget** on certain days in some places.

PARIS VAN JAVA (PVJ)



Paris Van Java Mall is located on Sukajadi street. If you like to hang out with friends and relatives, visiting Paris Van Java Mall is a great place to be. Because this mall has an outdoor concept featured by various amusements and cafes, you will find tons of restaurants and cafes.

BANDUNG INDAH PLAZA (BIP)



Students usually prefer to hang out at Bandung Indah Plaza (BIP). Because this mall is located in the middle of the city, the location is very strategic, and it stands side-by-side with other shopping centers, such as Bandung Electronik Center (BEC). In addition to that, Gramedia, as the largest book shop, is also located next to BIP.

CIHAMPELAS WALK (CIWALK)



CIWALK is located on Cihampelas street. The concept of the mall is outdoor and very friendly for pedestrians. In the beginning, this mall is a shopping center. However, as time goes by, CIWALK turns into a hangout place by the tourists and the locals because it often holds off-air events by some event organizers and TV stations.

TRANS STUDIO MALL (TSM)



Trans Studio Mall is formerly known as Bandung Supermall. It is located on Gatot Subroto street. This mall is built in the same area as Trans Studio Bandung, one of Indonesia's biggest indoor theme parks. It is also close to Trans Luxury Hotel, which is one of the best hotels in Bandung. You can feel like being spoiled if you come to this mall. Because you can shop, play at the theme park, and then stay at the hotel on the same day.

BRAGA CITY WALK



Braga City Walk is located on the legendary street, Braga. Braga City Walk adapts to the concept of mixed-use development. It means the mall consists of a shopping mall, condominium, and hotel. The thing that makes this mall looks unique is the old historic buildings around the mall. You can also walk to Asia Afrika street, where Gedung Merdeka and Alun-Alun are located.

ISTANA PLAZA (IP)



Istana Plaza is located on Pasirkaliki street. The location is very strategic, near Husein Sastranegara Airport and Bandung Train Station. Istana Plaza is one of the malls with a complete facility and is full of people on the weekend. The concept of Istana Plaza mall is a family mall, where almost all of the family needs are available here.

ENTERTAINMENT







If you're going to the mall, usually there'll be some entertainment there like:

- Cinema (CGV, XXI, Cinepolis)
- Game center (Game Master, Time Zone, Story Land, Fun World)
- Karaoke

In addition to that, Bandung also has several interesting recreational spots which are located on the outskirts of Bandung, like:

Tebing Keraton

Tebing Keraton is one of the natural attractions in Bandung. This tourist destination has an exotic natural panorama; a green expanse of forest covered with fog can be seen from the top of the cliff. The refreshing air makes the Tebing Keraton is a good choice for walking or cycling track. Sunrise and sunset become a phenomenon that you can enjoy in the Tebing Keraton.



Orchid Forest

Open daily from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. The Orchid Forest features the Horse Ranch as its main attraction. You can ride horses while enjoying the forest's scenery. Afterward, you can enjoy picnics with a package worth IDR 180,000 for four people, including picnic equipment and food.





Nu Art Sculpture Park

Opened for the public in 2000, Nu Art Sculpture Park was built as a home to Nyoman Nuarta's most notable artworks since the beginning of his career. Several years later, Nu Art Sculpture Park evolved into a more prominent art institution. It now becomes a home for many modern and contemporary arts from Indonesia's most talented artists. Fun fact, Nu Art Sculpture Park is also the very place where Nyoman Nuarta built his famous Garuda Wisnu Kencana statue piece by piece.



Floating Market Lembang

Open from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. The Floating Market offers boats and paddle boats for visitors to rent. Mini pedicabs are also available, though only one visitor per pedicab is allowed for now. Other attractions include Mini City and an outbound facility. You can also rent traditional Japanese costumes. The entry fee for Floating Market is IDR 30.000 per person.



HEALTH & SAFETY



Bandung also has dozen of hospitals and public health centers. You can find a public health center or **Puskesmas** at least one in each subdistrict. The closest Puskesmas from Politeknik Negeri Bandung is Puskesmas Sarijadi and the second closest one is Puskesmas Sukarasa.

If you're a student in Politeknik Negeri Bandung, you can get free health services in Poliklinik Politeknik Negeri Bandung, located beside the main campus. Poliklinik is open from 9.00 to 15.00 on Monday, Wednesday, Friday and up to 14.00 on Tuesday & Thursday.

Introduction to Urang Sunda



Are you ready to meet Urang Sunda?

Urang Sunda means Sundanese People. It refers to people from the Sundanese ethnic (West Java), a native of most students and residents around Politeknik Negeri Bandung campus.

Urang Sunda are sincere and friendly people. They are very welcome to guests or new persons, and it will not be difficult for you to start a friendship with them. Despite that, most of them tend to be demure. You have to be the one who makes the initiative.

THE WELL

How To Be Friend with Urang Sunda

- Show that you're friendly, don't hesitate to smile, nod, or say "hi" to new people.
- Be curious, ask questions, but don't look for similarities. You can share your different hobbies or mindset instead.
- Join a student club or create friendships with friends of friends. Besides expanding your circle, you can find a new friend who shares similar characteristics in this way.

CULTURE CODE OF MANNER



Sundanese culture also establishes a reasonably obvious manner, especially inter-age interactions. Young people should respect and not argue with older people. The language used must also be polite, and it is not good to look into the older person's eyes when being counseled. It is a must for the younger to put the hands of older people on their forehead as a way to greet them.

CULTURE "PUNTEN" AND "MANGGA"

Two words that will be very familiar to your ears when with Sundanese people are "punten" and "mangga". Don't be surprised if the Sundanese people pass you by, and then they will bow the head and upper body and say punten. It is the informal greeting they use to everybody they meet. And the answer to punten is mangga. This culture shows that Sundanese values respect for people by following an unwritten code of behavior.

CULTURE NGALIWET

It is called **Liwet**.

Liwet is a traditional Sundanese food. Rice is cooked in coconut milk, chicken broth, and various seasonings such as bay leaves and lemongrass using a special pan called **kastrol**.

This dish can be served alongside many side dishes like chicken, egg, tempeh, and vegetable. Traditionally, *liwet* is served on banana leaves.



Eating liwet tradition called **ngaliwet** or **botram**. On this occasion, *liwet* will be laid out on banana leaves, and people sit surrounding the dish. They eat liwet together using their right hand. *Urang Sunda* likes to celebrate togetherness with family or friends in this way, which creates a beautiful culture that maintains a long-lasting relationship. They also welcome to invite guests to join them.



BATIK

If you go to a formal meeting that requires someone to wear neat clothes in Indonesia, you will most likely see people wearing batik clothes. Batik is an Indonesian technique of wax resisting dyeing applied on fabric, resulting in a beautiful and unique pattern.

UNESCO has officially recognized batik as the Masterpiece of Oral and Intangible Heritage of Humanity from Indonesia since October 2, 2009. Since this, Indonesians have also celebrated National Batik Day on October 2 every year. Therefore it is encouraged people, especially in Indonesia, to use and develop the craftmanship of batik.

There are three types of batik if distinguished from the technique of making it: **stamped batik** (*batik cap*), **written batik** (*batik tulis*), and **painted batik** (*batik tulis*).

TRADITIONAL CLOTHES



Kebaya is one of the traditional clothes that comes from the culture of the Javanese. In general, kebaya is worn at certain celebration parties, from formal parties with business associates, weddings, traditional celebrations, independence events, and school celebrations such as graduation.



Pangsi is a clothing suit for men in the form of a plain shirt that is a bit loose-fitting and pants that are also loose, and the length does not exceed the ankles. This clothing is typical of several ethnic groups, especially Betawi and Sundanese. Pangsi generally looks like black clothes from top to bottom, used to protect the body.

LANGUAGE

The original language of *Urang Sunda* is **Sundanese Language**, even though most Sundanese are bilingual. Generally, Sundanese is used among family members and friends daily, while Indonesian is used in public. When they speak in Indonesia, you can still hear the Sundanese preposition like "mah" or "teh", and it is becoming the unique characteristic of Urang Sunda in speaking.

Sundanese is exceptionally diverse, with various regional dialects. All have different levels of formality depending on the interlocutors' social status. However, Sundanese used daily is an everyday language variant and does not pay much attention to formality.

Here are some example of an expression that you can use in your daily speaking in Indonesian and Sundanese

Sometimes giving some souvenirs from your country is a good thing to do before coming back. So, make sure if you have enough budget and luggage space, buy some souvenirs to give to your new friends and lecturer. That way, we can show our respect and appreciation towards the people that contribute or are part of our exchange program.

It's nice to have something to remind you of your study abroad experience. Buy some souvenirs from the traditional market or store that can become a memorable thing for you. You can bring souvenirs for your family, friends in your hometown and it is also essential to get souvenirs for people who helped you go abroad such as your lecturer.

Donate any items that you can't bring home with you



Going home after studying abroad is a great excuse to cut down on things you don't need. You can donate them, give them to your local friends or bring them to a donation center.

Last but not least



After finishing the exchange program, there are also essential things we need to prepare. Every exchange program usually has its way before ending program. It could be an awarding night, closing ceremony, dinner, etc. It will be good to wear traditional clothes from your country since we need to leave a good impression on your culture.

UPON YOUR DEPARTURE

Get your transcript



After finishing all the events, prepare all the documents before leaving. We can ask for a transcript of the class that we took while joining the exchange program. If it is not a student exchange program, ask for a certificate or letter showing we have participated in the program. Usually, the college or organization has already prepared it for us.

Check Everything



Once the departure time arrives, make sure you have already packed everything, including the essential documents, before going to the airport. Check all your documents such as your passport, flight ticket again. Your flight departure time and also don't forget to bring all the student documents.

⋖ Go to the Airport



After arriving at the airport, immediately transfer your luggage to the airlines that you choose so you can walk freely or stroll around the airport while waiting for your flight.

While waiting, you can use your time to eat breakfast or lunch or maybe shopping. But remember always to check the time so you will not be late. Do not forget to check your flight's transit time if you need to transit before continuing the flight.

UPON YOUR ARRIVAL



Upon your arrival in your country, contact your family, friends, or university and the people from the exchange program and tell them that you have already arrived safely. Take your luggage and go to the immigration counter, so you can immediately meet your family or friends who wait for your arrival. If you bought much stuff, sometimes you will need to go to the tax counter to pay for your purchase tax after coming out from the immigration counter.
